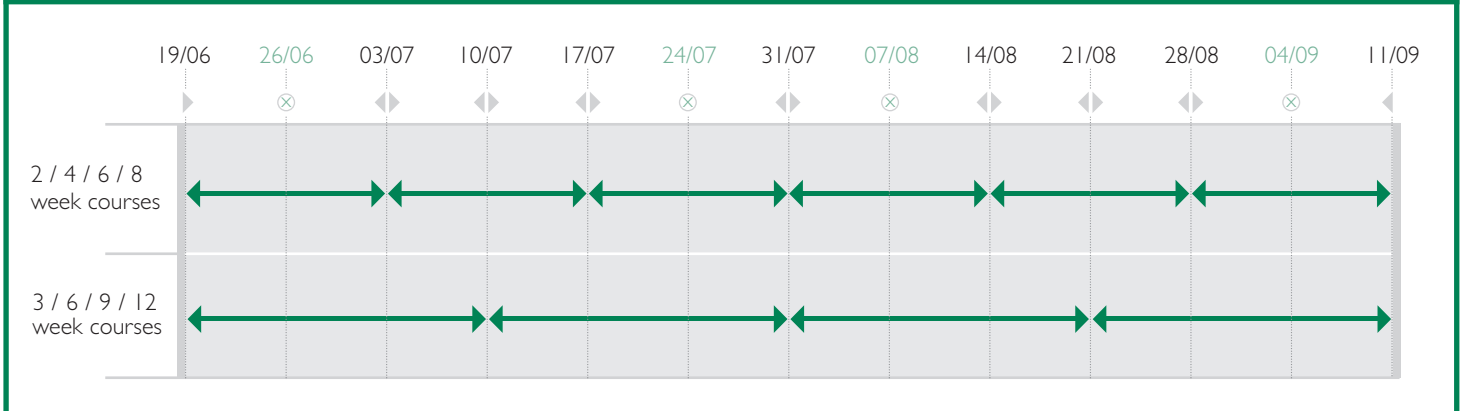

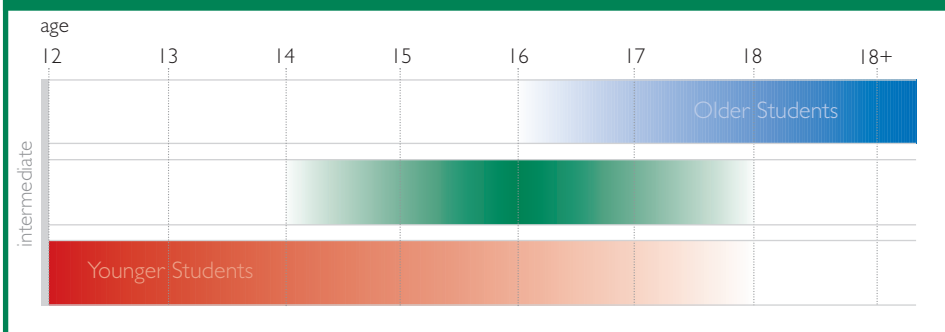
### Ages and Levels

Summer Course students are divided by age and by ability. You will be tested on your first day and will be placed in an appropriate level.

We run classes from elementary to advanced. The chart below shows the age ranges in the 3 intermediate classes we plan to run at the beginning of August.

The minimum age on the Summer Course is 14. However, for the first 3 weeks in August we also accept students aged 12 and 13 and provide additional classes (see below).

The summer timetable is a balance of grammar, reading, writing, listening and speaking skills. Some of these lessons are linked to our weekly accompanied visit and the weekly full-day excursion each Saturday to Whitby, Fountains Abbey, Manchester Science Museum or The Lake District.

### Accommodation

We take great care when selecting families and always try to help with special requests. We place great emphasis on welfare. Younger students have to follow the College curfew regulations and we are happy to set earlier times if parents wish.

### Younger students on the Summer Course

We take our younger students seriously and we expect our younger students to take the course seriously. Younger students enjoy all the facilities of the College and, of course, the teaching is of the same high standard for all our students!

The low minimum age allows students to enjoy a serious summer course. The course does not suit everyone and some younger students might be more comfortable on an activity course or a children's course. Students under the age of 18 at the start of their course are automatically on full-board and will get a bus pass.

### Accompanied Transfer Service

All courses start on a Saturday. For students under the age of 18 at the start of their course, we include a free transfer service. Students are met at Manchester and Leeds Airports and escorted to York. The courses end on a Saturday. We take the students back to the airport, help them with check-in and make sure they go through security in time to catch their plane. Older students can opt to join the transfer service for a small additional charge.
